



Uniform Regulations (2015-16)

GIRLS

Junior School to 5th Form:

Bedstone Kilt, plain blue socks/tights, plain white blouse, Bedstone Jacket with College badge, Bedstone Pullover (when cold)

Blouse can be 'fitted' but must be **tucked into kilt** (to avoid 'rolling' of kilts)

Blouses must also have a collar (Rever Collar)

Socks/tights must be plain

Minimum Kilt length must be 'on the knee' and **NOT** above it.

Black shoes: must be 'flat' soled (heel maximum; 3 cm) and must be polishable/patent

Scarves: In cold weather, navy blue scarves are permitted. These must be plain and not 'fringed'. They should not be worn indoors.

VI Form girls:

Suit: Either a business skirt or trousers **AND A MATCHING SUIT JACKET**. Plain cardigans/pullovers can be worn underneath a jacket but not instead of one.

Plain tights/stockings (appropriate colour)

Black shoes: must be 'flat' soled (heel maximum; 3 cm) and must be polishable/patent

All Girls:

Hair: Must be tied back at all times (unless short) using a plain clip or band.
May be 'over the shoulder' but not over the face, or covering the eyes.
In lessons where there may be health and safety issues, hair must be tied 'up' and away from shoulders and the face when requested. Girls not complying with this will be removed from the class.
No dyeing of hair allowed although light tinting is permitted provided it is in keeping with the natural colour.
A small amount of hair gel/mousse/fixing spray is allowed provided that the resulting hair style conforms to acceptable norms.

Ear-rings: **ONE** set of small studs only. Can be gold/silver/stone. They can be worn in the lower lobe only.

Rings: One ring only (plain and discreet).

For Health and Safety reasons no jewellery may be worn for PE/Games/DT lessons/Science lessons.

Scarves: In cold weather, navy blue scarves are permitted. These must be plain and not 'fringed'. They should not be worn indoors.

Make-up: No eye shadow, lipstick, mascara, nail polish, eyeliner.
A discrete amount of 'nude' foundation may be worn.

BOYS

Junior School to 5th Form:

Grey trousers, white shirt, plain dark socks, school tie (or colours/house tie), Bedstone Blue jacket (purchased from the school shop and not a substitute), Bedstone Pullover (when cold).

Top button must be fastened.
Ties must be 'done up' to the top button.
Ties must end at the top of the trousers, (belt line)
Shirts must be tucked in at all times.

Black shoes: must be 'flat' and polishable.

VI Form Boys:

A lounge suit, plain/pin-striped shirt, school tie (or colours/house/prefect tie), socks may be hooped/coloured/plain.

A plain navy blue or black V-neck sweater may be worn under a jacket in the winter months.

In the summer term a jacket/blazer and different coloured trousers may be worn instead of suit. Jackets/blazers and trousers must be plain and the colour must be in keeping with business norms.

A waistcoat is permissible provided that it is of a plain design.

Top button must be fastened.
Ties must be done up to the top button.
Ties must end at the top of the trousers, (belt line)
Shirts must be tucked in at all times.

Black shoes: must be 'flat' and polishable.

All Boys:

Hair: Must be short enough that it doesn't need to be tied back. Hair cannot be shorter than a hairdresser's 'number 2'. There can be no 'sculpting' of hair (hair which has been cut to distinctively different lengths)
Hair should not be over the face/eyes or be below the collar.
No dying of hair allowed.
A small amount of hair gel is allowed provided that the resulting hair style conforms to acceptable norms.

Ear-rings: No boy may wear an ear-ring.
Rings: One plain signet ring is allowed.

For Health and Safety reasons no jewellery may be worn for PE/Games/DT lessons/Science lessons.

Scarves: In cold weather, navy blue scarves are permitted. These must be plain and not 'fringed'. They should not be worn indoors.

Summer dress:

The Deputy Headmaster will decide when summer dress may be worn.

Girls: Uniform regulations (minus jacket). A short sleeved blouse may be worn.

Boys: Uniform regulations (minus jacket and tie). A short sleeved shirt may be worn

Students may be sent home if they fail to comply with uniform requests, or if their hair fails to meet acceptable standards.

In all disputes over uniform the Headmaster's decision is final.

Dress at mealtimes:

Breakfast:

Girls: School uniform (jackets do not have to be worn).
Hair can be down

Boys: School uniform (jackets and ties do not have to be worn; shirts can be open collared but must be tucked into trousers)

Lunch:

Girls: Full school uniform, including jackets.

Boys: Full school uniform, including jackets and ties.

Tea:

Girls: Full school uniform, including jackets.

Boys: Full school uniform, including jackets and ties.

OR

Full tracksuit if coming in from games.

Supper:

Girls/Boys: Own clothes (odd-job). No extremes of fashion. No hats/headwear.
