

Cross Country runners take Shropshire hills and mud in their stride

More than 900 young athletes donned their running shoes and battled up hills and through mud during the recent Midlands





Bedstone was proud to host the prestigious competition for the 18th consecutive year, with more than 40 schools competing from across the region.

Students competed in age based categories across a variety of testing distances, with those under 10 years old running a 1500 metre race, and senior boys running the longest distance of 6000 metres.

The event is a prelude to the National competition at Worksop

College where the top ten runners from each region qualify to compete. Bedstone College runners performed well, with 5 automatic places and 1 reserve qualifier representing the Midlands area in

the Finals.

Jamie Simpson, Head of Boys' PE, said: "It was wonderful to see so many young athletes and Midlands schools coming together. We are glad to be able to host this event, and this year we saw an increase in the number of high performing students achieving fantastic times in very



challenging conditions across fields, in woods and through stream crossings. We are delighted to have so many Bedstone runners achieve qualification for the National Finals."



Cadet On Target For Canadian Shooting Exchange

Cadet Lance Corporal William Arden, a Bedstone pupil and member of Shropshire Army Cadet Force (ACF), has earned the chance to spend seven weeks in Canada as part of the UK Army Cadet Force and Royal Canadian Army Cadet (RCA) bilateral exchange.

William was one of the youngest members of his team in last year's shooting competition held at Bisley ranges, winning fourth place in the National 500 metre shoot and securing his place in Canada.

The seven weeks is fully sponsored by the ACF and held at Connaught Ranges in Canada where William will attend the RCAC Marksmanship Full-Bore Rifle Course, offering a challenging but rewarding experience.

The County Shooting Officer, RSMI Kevin Pound said "William is one of only 12 cadets selected nationally to make up the UK team and we are extremely proud of him to be the first cadet from Shropshire to represent the UK."



Country Pursuits: A New Bedstone Initiative

Artistic Talent On Display

It has continued to be a busy time in the Art Department, with students developing their artistic talents, as well as receiving recognition for their work at regional exhibitions and enjoying visits to local galleries.

The Art Department took the Year 9 Artists on an away day to Machynlleth and Aberystwyth in January where the group were able to experience several varied exhibitions. At MOMA in Machynlleth attention was focused on an exhibition of monochrome images, looking at how these images had been made - the kind of mark making and use of tonal contrast, to convey a story. At the Art Centre in Aberystwyth students had the opportunity to see the wonderfully lively drawings for the designs for film and theatre by the renowned political cartoonist Gerald Scarfe; an opportunity to see the design work in the context of our own mini-filmic ambitions.

Earlier in the term, Hereford College of Art held an exhibition celebrating the art of young people in schools throughout Herefordshire and the surrounding counties. Bedstone submitted skilful works in a variety of media by 11 of our

young people. In the setting of the communal area of the Art School the art works looked very fine. It was a particularly special thing for Catherine C to receive a *Highly Commended* certificate for her acrylic painting.

These awards were bestowed on only a very few of the exhibitors by the principal of the Art School, and in Catherine's case this was in recognition of the high standard of work and interesting imagery
