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# Junior School Activities and Events

The Junior School pupils and staff have been busy all term, taking part in a wide variety of fun and educational activities and events, both inside and outside the classroom.

From studying the effects of soil erosion, deposition and transportation in Geography, as well as exploring rivers and water features on an Ordnance Survey, to making Origami Sumo Wrestlers and enjoying outdoor activities (such as Rhian taking part in Horse Riding lessons).
